

HOLME-NEXT-THE-SEA PARISH COUNCIL

MEETING OF 6th SEPTEMBER 2011

The Council discussed the quotes for the southern area of Park Piece but further investigation into scraping the pond and planting the area was to be carried out. Plans were discussed for tree planting in the autumn and some advice will be sought on this matter and reported to the next meeting. A report of horses using the land had been received and it was agreed to monitor the situation.

The property for let at 27 Beach Road had received a number of applications and these were given consideration at the meeting. It is hoped that the bungalow will very shortly be occupied once again.

Matters raised since the last meeting included the lack of cats eyes along the Main Road and the trees that need inspection on Orchard Lane that are not all in good condition. The matter of overhanging trees at the bus stop area, raised at the last meeting, is due to be dealt with by the Highways department. The Council has also been offered advice on waste reduction initiatives and an invitation will be sent to suggest a short talk at a Council meeting in the near future.

A report at the meeting, from one of our Borough Councillors, advised that Holme-next-the-Sea does not have any sites that have been identified for possible development within the Local Development Framework.

Finances included payment of gardening expenses and village hall insurance.

A planning application for an extension of time on a planning permission for Pepper Pot Cottage was recommended for approval.
